- Built within the erosion zone, ultimately requiring new seawalls on the beach
- Over 128 acres of wetland fill and disturbance
- 36 tons of pollutants per year; 20 tons toxic; 28 tons known to appear in groundwater, applied over a sole source aquifer year after year after year
- 28 acres of new impervious surfaces draining to the Ocean and Estuary
- Privatization of our public beaches
- Destruction of one of the State's most precious places
